Program General Information

- Program Dates: June 13 – July 8, 2011 (19 days).

- 1,458 Students in Attendance
- Students selected two classes for each morning (K-Jump Start: full morning)
- Each student was required to include at least one literacy or mathematics class in their schedule
- Open House was held the evening of Wednesday July 7th 6:00 – 8:00 p.m.
